(E) *ho tu cyriu onos*

(F) *ho tu oicu cyrios*

(G) *ho tōn adelphōn oicos*

(H) *hoi tōn cyriōn hyioi*

(1) the donkey of the master

(2) the brothers of the merchant

(3) the merchants of the donkeys

(4) the sons of the masters

(5) the slave of the sons

(6) the masters of the slaves

(7) the house of the brothers

(8) the master of the house
